Lymphatic Filariasis is a neglected tropical disease manifesting as lymphoedema commonly known as elephantiasis or in Hindi Haathi Paun. Filariasis is a disease transmitted by mosquito, affecting millions of poor people across the world. The global program for the elimination of Lymphatic Filariasis was launched in 2000 by the World Health Organization. Global Alliance for Elimination of Lymphatic Filariasis (GAELF) is now focussing on the treatment of the disease, Lymphoedema. IAD's integrated medicine treatment is acknowledged as the best available treatment to stop advancing lymphoedema and reverse the fibrosis initiated in the dermis, reactive changes in the epidermis and subcutaneous tissues.

In contrast to most medical treatments of lymphoedema that are too demanding with a less than adequate response, integrative medicine treatment is a low cost, self-care and family member assisted program. The Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India, funded a successful community trial of this treatment in endemic villages.

It is the poor people in rural populations who are primarily affected by Filariasis. IAD devised a suitable program that employed simple technology, is easy to administer and teach, and most importantly at low cost. By adopting all the principles of primary health care; community participation, intersectoral coordination, appropriate technology, and equitable distribution treatment recorded significant quality of life improvements due to morbidity reduction of lymphoedema (see Figure).

With 20 years of experience in Evidence-Based Integrative Medicine for Lymphatic Filariasis and other Chronic Dermatoses, we are conducting the 10th national colloquium on 2020 February 18 to 20. The focus theme is to discuss the public health program mode for MMDP of Lymphatic Filariasis in villages using Integrative Medicine treatment protocol.

Experts in lymphoedema, dermatology, vector-borne diseases, yoga, and Ayurveda will lead the discussion on the MMDP of Lymphatic Filariasis. The colloquium also allows attending the medical camps organised for lymphoedema patients who received integrated medical treatments. **Prof Vaughan Keeley**, Royal Derby Hospital, UK, will be conducting bed-side teaching of lymphoedema during the medical camp. Experts from Dowling Club, an affiliate to British Association of Dermatologists, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, New Delhi and Institute for Postgraduate Teaching and Research in Ayurveda, Jamnagar, Gujarathave confirmed participation.

IAD colloquiums don't charge delegate fee. However, participants are requested to register prior and inform if they wish to eat at the venue by paying for their food in advance.

We cordially invite to participate in this interactive national platform to contribute to advancing lymphoedema research and integrated medicine and learn from evidence-based integrated treatment protocols.


